**Monitoring Requirements Not Met for ICMSA Crooked Creek**

Our water system violated several drinking water standards over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

*We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2024 we failed to monitor for the following contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.*

**What should I do?**

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, the required sampling frequency, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which corrective action samples were (or will be) taken.

**What happened? What was done? When will it be resolved?**

The laboratory encountered an equipment issue and was unable to run the HAA5 samples within hold time. Consequently, the HAA5s had to be resampled however it was out of the + or - 3-day window from February 19, 2024 that the DEP requires for sampling. The HAA5s were resampled as soon as the lab informed ICMSA of the issue, analyzed and reported.

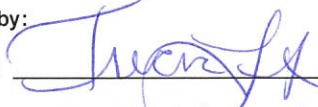

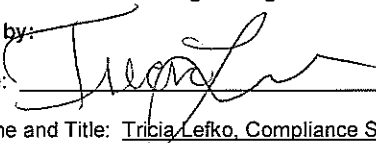
